

Organization Development

The Organization Assessment was done in March 2009 as NJBB is gearing up for the finalization of a long term perspective planning for the next five years – 2010 to 2015. The participatory OD Process was facilitated by ASK-Delhi with the support of Cordaid, The Netherlands.

Having a series of discussions during the process of Organizational Development, Navajeevan Bala Bhavan slightly modified the organogram, vision, mission and strategic planning.

A revisit to the strategy/processes of the organization, made NJBB revise the Vision and Mission. And included children being infected or affected with HIV/AIDS apart from the existing target groups (Street children, child workers/out of school children, children in government homes, street youth and children from marginalized communities especially girl children)



Mr. A. C. Joseph Chandran, an acclaimed expert on Human Resource Development and senior consultant, offered his expertise in development of Job descriptions, Human Resource Manual (Human Resource Policies and Procedures vis-à-vis recruitment, selection, induction, probation, performance appraisal systems, transfers, promotion, increments etc) and Service Rules of the organization. This is a milestone in the history of Navajeevan Bala Bhavan. It will pave the way for systemic progress of the individuals as well as organization as a whole. 

Chantamma, a 15-year old former child labour was rescued and brought to Navajeevan to provide education and hence, joined her in Residential Bridge School for girl children, Sethu, in 2002 and started to learn almost from the scratch. She made giant strides in her studies; moved rather quickly to the main stream school to join class IV in a Govt. school with residence in a Govt. run Social Welfare Hostel for girl children at Gunadala, Vijayawada. Navajeevan Bala Bhavan continued to give her the necessary support. She passed her school final exams (Class X) with an aggregate of 547 marks out of a total of 600. It was amazing performance for a girl from such a background. That was not the end. She qualified for admission into a very prestigious college of engineering in Indian Institute of Information and Technology and is attending the college staying in campus hostel at Nuzvid. While many other kids from the rich and powerful families had to beat a hasty retreat, crest fallen, Chantamma, the once poor child labour, made it! It was the result of her grit, courage, strong determination and of course hard work.



Chandu is totally orphan. He does not know who his parents are. When he was a small boy, somebody brought him to sisters of Mother Teresa. At the age of 4, he was sent to Don Bosco Premnivas in Mangalagiri. He studied up to 10th class ithere. After that, he was sent to Nalgonda for his Intermediate (2yrs course). He passed it with 587/1000 of marks. After the completion of intermediate, he graduated from B.Sc (Medical Lab Technician). He had strong desire to become the doctor. He sustained his desire to become doctor and cleared the admission test. Neverthless, he cou course he tried to get into medicine (MBBS) but he could succeed in gaining admission into Pharmacology. He is currently studying M.Sc (Pharmacology) in G S L Medical College Rajahmundry



Rama Subbiah hails from a very poor family. His parents work as Agriculture Coolies. They ran into debts. As such, Subbaiah was stopped from going to school and put to work in a medical shop. Subbaiah, unwillingly started working. One day, he found that there is no rice in their house to cook. In order to buy rice, he stole Rs.100 from the shop, but he was afraid to go home and give the money to his parents and equally afraid was he to return the money to the shop. The only solution he could think of was to run away. That brought him to Vijayawada.

He is an intelligent student and nterested in studies. He was admitted to school and he ranked second among the students of his school in the Xth class public examinations.

He had successfully completed his intermediate with an aggregate of 80% marks.

He completed his Bachelor's degree in Biochemistry and went on to complete his post graduation as well, coming out as the topper in his class. He now works as lecturer.



Samson is from Vijayawada. His parent's are Raja and Mariyamma. His father is a Cook, and mother is a housewife. He has two siblings. Samson left his home accidently by getting into a train which was moving. A few days later his father came to know of this incident from his uncle. The family members and relatives were searching for him all over Andhra. But it was in vain. They could not find him!!!

The boy had been missing from his uncle's home since 15th July 2008. The parents put an ad in the news paper about their missing child on 3rd September 2008. The boy was in Goa juvenile home.(Scan of India). On 22nd November 2009, Fr. Koshy (CWC chair person) got mail from scan India whether he could help the child to get back home to his parents. Navajeevan took the initiative to bring him back home.

When the parents saw the child after one year of separation, they couldn't believe their own eyes and it resulted in mixed feelings. There is no end to their joy The child also felt the absence of parents and family members very badly. Their reunion made the child as well as parents feel happy and consoled. By this time the child had forgotten his own mother tongue as he was speaking Hindi ever since he missed his way and landed up in Goa.

. On 11th December '09, the child and father came to Navajeevan Bala Bhavan to express their sincere thanks.



YASWANTH, 1 ½ years of age – was playing while his mother was cleaning the bathroom with toilet cleaning acid. She kept the acid bottle near the bathroom door. The innocent little kid playfully opened the acid bottle and swallowed the contents. Realizing what had happened - the mother deserted by her husband a few months ago got panicked, but failed to do the needful first aid immediately. Though the child was continuously vomiting, she could not manage to admit the child to a good hospital.

As the case was brought to the notice of NJBB village facilitator by the village activists, she consulted Fr.Koshy, who referred the case immediately Dr. Parthasarathy, a pediatric surgeon, known to him and rushed the child to NRI Medical College Hospital. As there was no pediatric endoscopy available there, the child had to be taken to Hyderabad, 280 kms away from Vijayawada. The doctors at Asian Institute of Gastroenterology in Hyderabad did the endoscopy at a subsidized cost. Considering the high cost of surgery at Hyderabad, the child was brought back to Vijayawada and the surgery was performed successfully and the child is fine again.

The interest taken by Fr. Koshy in the case to save the child gave a great impetus to the project team of the newly initiated "Child Safety Net" – to secure the safety and development of each child of the target villages.

The 4 year old **SK. PARVEZ**, with cleft lips, is from Sanathnagar in Kanuru village of Penamaluru Mandal. His mother is physically challenged, her legs having been affected by polio. Sk. Parvez's father is a daily wage worker but alcoholic and never bothered about his family.

On 3-11-2009, the case of the child was noted by a Village Activist of Child safety net project to Mrs. Sukanya. She, along with the Village Facilitator, took the child to C.W.C, Krishna District and Fr. Koshy, the CWC Chairperson, in turn, referred the case to Dr. Ajay Banerji of SIBAR Dental Care Centre. As per Dr. Ajay's advice, On 14-11-2009, the child was admitted to Vijetha Hospital under the care of Dr. P.M.C Naidu. The child was operated upon for the repair of cleft lips on 16-11-2009. The surgery was successful and Parvez was discharged from the hospital on 23-11-2009.

The total cost of the operation, Rs.30,000/-, was borne by the hospital itself. Navajeevan had to put in around Rs.10,000/- for the travels and other expenses.



Kotturi Venkatalakshmi, 16 years, of Chodavaram village, is from a very poor family. Her father who is physically disabled works as a cobbler and mother work as daily labor, together earning a measly Rs.1800 a month. She is second among four siblings. She studied from 2nd to 7th class in Mustabad Government School. After finishing her 7th class she was sitting at home doing nothing as the school was till 7th class only. The parents could not afford to send her for further schooling due to their poor financial condition.

It was during 2006, Ms. Vani met her and seeing her interest to study further sent her with two of her younger sisters to Sethu, the Residential Bridge School for girls. From Sethu she was send to Gunadala hostel and completed her tenth. Sec scored 2nd class in 10th.

Fr. Michael suggested her to do MPHW course. She was very happy with the suggestion and has joined the course and her younger sisters are at school as well, staying in the hostel run by the Government at Penamaluru. She aims to complete her studies and support the family in future.

Other Events

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Chiguru Hosts YaR Meet 2010

This year's YaR (Yong at Risk) Meet was held at Chiguru – Navajeevan's Children's Village. 300 children from different Navajeevan YaR Centres of the Province located at different cities/towns in Andhra Pradesh arrived to take part in the three day meet. The Meet was a great success and it also marked the founding of the work for street children in Vijayawada 21 years ago.









Chiguru being Renovated – Post Floods

After a devastating flood in the first week of October 2009, Chigru has now bounced back to full life – with new bitumen roads laid out; painted anew with colours refreshing to eyes; installed new noiseless but powerful generator to cope up with the frequent power-cuts; newly constructed gobar-gas plant to be operated with the dung from the cattle reared at the village; permanently fixed sound and LCD systems and air-conditioners in the training halls; etc. The laying of new drainage system is in the process.
